First into action in Afghanistan and Ukraine

In Afghanistan, AKE supported some of the last few remaining journalists who were reporting from Kabul, guaranteeing the safe evacuation of local staff and families of media corporations. Afterwards, AKE worked with some of the first journalists returning to Afghanistan after the Taliban's takeover.



In Ukraine, February 2022, these rigorous procedures and resilient relationships allowed AKE to utilise a local network, working with partners who have direct contacts in ministerial offices in Kyiv, helping to provide solutions for border crossings, securing accreditations, navigating checkpoints and arranging frontline news gathering.
